# 3. Review of Petitions

### Petitioners:

### A. Baroud -21 Lowland St.

Located next to the rail trail crossing.

Requesting stop signs on either side of the rail trail. Concern in particular for students who will be using the Rail Trail to get to the Woodland St. campus (increased number of walkers/bike riders with the closure of Woodland St).

- · Rob Walker to talk to the Rail Trail Committee about putting barriers.
- Can we legally put up stop signs where a sidewalk is now being added to Lowland St?

According to MA DOT, in order to put up stop signs, we need to fulfill one of the following:

- 6,000 vehicles- our highest was 2,100 vehicles
- · response to crashes no crashes in the past
- · restricted view exists- there is no restriction

Rob Walker talked to Rail Trail- there are regulations on what can be placed on rail trail (MUTCD (7), the R5-3.

Can we have SRO/Crossing Guards stand on the Rail Trail to re-educate the pedestrians on the trail? Lt. Barrett will be reaching out to the Safe Routes to School Committee to review if there are any options for this particular instruction.

# A. 55 Bittersweet Circle (off Hollist St) - R. Cellupica

Asking for Crosswalk from the end of their sidewalk to the opposite side of Flashing Pedestrian sign Signage to indicate the crosswalk

#### B. 54 Turner Road - E. Harrison

Lower Turner Road was built as a cul de sac where it ended at the stream.

Increased traffic when the condos went in at the top of Turner Road

Increased landscapers, Amazon trucks

Concern about 22 new single family homes, 2 duplexes being built off of Indian Ridge Rd

### Proposal:

- Return lower Turner Road to a cul de sac design (it was designed this way originally and changed when the condos were built
- Maintain road connection between lower Turner Road and Indian Ridge South. End upper Turner Road at the condominium complex, redesigning upper Turner Road as a cul de sac. Connect upper and lower Turner Road via a walking path.
- 3. Add sidewalks and 4 speed bumps along lower Turner Rd

\*TAC felt that these proposals fall under the purview of the Planning Board, Directed petitioner to Karen Sherman/Karen Langston and Planning Board and Town Administrator Travis Ahern.
